Call for contributions Special Issue História da Historiografia

História da Historiografia, a Brazilian journal specializing in the theory of history, the history of historiography, intellectual history, and related areas, invites researchers to submit special issue proposals. Proposals for publication in 2024 must be submitted by **March 1st, 2023,** using the following form: https://forms.gle/SG2gtaTcsQ8keuCW6. We will publish the results on March 15th.

Proposals can be submitted in Portuguese, English or Spanish and should include the following information:

- Name and institutional affiliation of two to four guest editors, at least one of which must be from a teaching and/or research institution located outside Brazil;
- Short title (maximum 7 words);
- A presentation of the proposal, indicating the context from which the proposal emerged;
- A statement of relevance, containing information on why the theme fits the scope of História da Historiografia.
